




YEAR IN REVIEW: 2021



Judith Manno Stager Right to Life Fund

A founding member of the Elk County Community Foundation, Judith created a Right to Life Fund. The fund states: 'Regardless of the circumstances surrounding conception, every human being is endowed with a dignity that must be unconditionally respected and safeguarded. With deep compassion for the vulnerable unborn who cannot fend for themselves, the Fund will award grants to nonprofits who advocate in defense of Life from Conception, Graduating from Villa Maria College, Judith worked in probation and parole before marrying and returning to Ridgway. After adopting two of their six children, she facilitated adoptions for more than 30 babies and arranged foster care, transportation and U.S. surgeries for dozens of international children. She established and managed her coal and trucking corporation for 40 years, chaired many state and area non-profit boards, headed a church addition, organized the building of a playground and launched a successful court case to save another play area. Judy has 20 grandchildren.

Bruce J. Longwill Memorial Fund

This memorial fund was established by Bob and Julie DeLullo to honor Bruce Longwill after his passing. Driving tractor trailer was Bruce's life enjoyment. During his life he enjoyed classic cars, and if they needed a wash and wax, he would spend hours until the job was completed. Awards will be given to groups and organizations that will give back to community needs, particularly emergency services, such as ambulances, fire companies, etc. The fund awards will be determined annually by Lorraine Longwill, Bruce's wife.

Smile for Tyler Pass-Through Fund

The Smile for Tyler fund was set up following Tyler Mancuso's sudden passing at the age of 25 in 2020. Tyler loved to make people smile. He would joke with people, talk to the elderly for hours, and help others when they were in need. It would hurt him to see people sad, so his family wanted to try and do something good in his name and get to know Tyler for the person he really was. Rather than making one person smile with a scholarship, they decided to try and make as many people smile as possible by doing something good for the community. To date, they have donated to the city to purchase the TruNarc device, raised money to purchase new equipment for Memorial Park, did a Smile for the Holidays, and donated gifts to the local hospitals for pediatric patients. Their goal is to continue to make as many people smile as they can.

Greater DuBois Community Development Fund

The Greater DuBois Community Development Fund was established through a bequest from the Ron Suplizio estate to benefit the community of DuBois and its residents. A committee is being formed to review grant applications and determine the direction the distribution of funds will take. Through this bequest in his will, Mr. Suplizio hoped to enhance the future of the DuBois area, the city where he was born, lived, and worked.

James & Gloria Straub Benedictine Sisters Fund continues to support Sr. Jacinta's ministry

As a part of her estate, Gloria Straub established the James and Gloria Straub Benedictine Sisters Fund to provide for the needs of the Benedictine Sisters who served our community for so many years. When the St. Joseph Monastery in St. Marys closed, Sr. Jacinta Conklin, OSB, pictured on the right with Paula Eddy, transferred her vows to the Erie Benedictines. Her ministries there have continued to keep her close to nature and close to people. She has been a community driver and library aide and shows her love of the earth through seasonal lawn care.

When she saw the need for a rough terrain vehicle (RTV) for use at their retreat center, the fund was able to grant the purchase of a vehicle to assist in better utilization of the three hermitages located in their woods. The RTV makes it much easier for all guests, especially the elderly and handicapped, to be transported with their luggage to the private, secluded retreat through wooded areas and paths affected by seasonal weather. It makes maintenance of the roads to the hermitages easier, along with care of the grounds, fences and trees.

This designated fund is helping to provide the Benedictine Sisters who have relocated from the local convent with the tools needed to carry on their mission wherever their ministry has taken them.

St. Boniface receives over \$103,000 from Sicheri Grants

Elk County Community Foundation (ECCF) leadership had the opportunity to visit the St. Boniface preschool. The Community Foundation provided a \$68,819 grant this year for the school and for tuition assistance for the students attending the Montessori based pre-school program. In addition, ECCF granted another \$34,369 to St. Boniface Church for their Faith Formation programs. These grants were made from the Frank and Josephine Sicheri Family Fund, a designated fund administered by the Foundation.

In 2017 ECCF received an estate gift from Zita Sicheri. Zita donated a good portion of her assets to the Community Foundation to establish the fund in honor of her parents. The fund was designated for the sole purpose of support to the St. Boniface Catholic Church and School in her community. This fund will provide an annual gift to the church and the school, along with a donation for tuition assistance for students attending the school.

Designated Grants provide tuition assistance at ECCSS

Designated funds are established by individuals who have a specific cause, vision or organization they wish to support. The Harold and Midge Lenze Tuition Assistance Fund; the Tom and Mary Rita Valentine Fund; and the Edna Geitner Bennett Memorial Scholarship Fund are all a testament to that vision. These ECCF permanent funds that designated monies to support Catholic education in the Elk County area were established by the donors in their estate plans. In addition, the Elk County Catholic School System (ECCSS) created an agency endowment fund with the foundation years ago which provides them with an annual unrestricted disbursement. This year's combined award for all of these individual funds was

2021 OPEN GRANTS AWARDED

Our Foundation's Open Grants Program allows eligible nonprofit organizations to apply for funding throughout the year. Grants are awarded through established funds, each having their own purpose, timeline, and requirements. Potential recipients submit an application and the grant is awarded to the winner following a competitive selection process by a single reviewer or a team of reviewers. The grants are made possible through the generosity of individuals, families, and organizations who have created funds to make a difference in their communities.

Vertical Baler grant helps save our environment from plastic bag waste

A \$5,000 grant from the Elk County Development Fund answered the need to add plastic grocery bags and film plastics to the list of acceptable items at the Elk County Recycling Center by assisting with the purchase of a vertical baler. The center began accepting this type of plastic in mid-June. The first bale, weighing 1,599 pounds was finished about 6 ½ weeks later. In addition to promoting plastic bag recycling from the public, the center reached out to the business community and now has bags and other film plastics delivered to them from grocery stores and factories. Adding this material to the list of items accepted by our local recycling center has enabled customers to recycle a commodity that was most often landed up in our landfills. It's a win-win for Elk County and its residents!



Bennett's Valley Senior Center improves parking and accessibility

The Elk County Development Fund awarded a grant to the Bennett's Valley Senior Center (BVSC) this past spring to help with the paving of their parking area. The \$7,000 grant was a portion of the full \$47,000 the Senior Center raised to complete the project. By eliminating the uneven surface and ponding during rain or snow events, seniors reduce their risk of falling from hazardous conditions, and enjoy the appearance of the center as they attend the social functions.

Donor Advised Funds • Endowed Established with a taxdeductible gift by individuals, families and companies who wish to actively participate in the grant making process. A percentage of the total fund can be awarded annually to charities recommended by you, The principal amount of money gifted will never be depleted. In this way, the fund will continue to give for good, forever. It is a great way of involving family members and succeeding generations in philanthropy.

Donor Advised Funds - Spend-Down Also called "Non-Endowed" funds. These are charitable checking accounts that support regular, ongoing grant activity. After establishing your fund at the Foundation, monies are immediately available for grant distribution to charities recommended by you. The money you provide has a finite existence. Unless additional funding is provided, the monies available for granting will run out over time. This type of fund can be used to take advantage of itemizing taxes on a rotating basis. See our article on "Bunching Strategy" on page 17.

Designated Funds With a designated fund, donors can support the good work of one or more specific nonprofit organizations. Almost any 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, municipality, or faith-based organization may be designated to receive support for its mission. You identify the recipient(s) and our staff manages the annual distribution of funds from the endowment.

Field of Interest Funds Donors pick their favorite, general charitable cause or field of interest. Donors can request the Foundation to award grants within defined spheres of interest such as the arts, health, education, the environment, or a geographic focus.

Unrestricted/Community Funds Unrestricted funds allow the greatest flexibility to the Community Foundation as it responds to emerging opportunities and unforeseen needs in the community. Income from these funds is used to award grants through our ongoing community grants process.

Scholarship Funds Although most of our scholarship funds target graduating high school seniors, you can establish a scholarship fund to help students at any grade level, from kindergarten to PhD. You choose the name of the scholarship, the eligibility criteria, and the award amount. The Foundation administers and manages all fiscal aspects of the fund - and most often the application, selection, and award processes as well.

Agency Endowment Funds These endowment funds are established by nonprofit organizations to provide perpetual income to them in support of their future operations. The Foundation handles all administrative and investment responsibilities.

How We Determine Our Spending Policy The spending policy allows the Community Foundation to pay out the most it can through its grant-making while enduring long-term growth of all permanently endowed funds. Generally, grants are not made from funds during the first year to best assure no deterioration of the original gift. Then annually, after reviewing market trends and current climate, the Board approves a spending policy for grant-making in the coming fiscal year. The spending policy of each endowment will be a percentage typically about 4% of the average market value over 3 years.

TAX TIP: DO YOU KNOW...

The "Bunching" Strategy?

may not be deductible on your tax return, depending on your ability to itemize in a given year. Charitable donations are deductible only if you itemize, which may be a less likely scenario for many taxpayers given today's higher standard deduction. (In 2022, \$12,950 for individuals and \$25,900 for married couples).


How can taxpayers benefit from the new tax law and get back some of the tax advantages of their charitable contributions? One word: bunching. Essentially, this means combining perhaps several years' worth of donations into a single tax year so that - along with your other deductions - you exceed the standard deduction. (You'd take the standard deduction in the interim years.)

Of course, bunching multiple contributions into a single year can feel daunting if you're not sure how much you want to give and to whom. So to build some flexibility into your giving plan, you may wish to set up a donor-advised fund account at the Community Foundation, which allows you to donate a lump sum in the current tax year, invest the funds for future growth and parcel out the money to qualified charities over time. The money can continue to appreciate once invested in a donor-advised fund account, which means the potential for even greater giving down the road.

A Donor Advised Fund may be the right choice for you.

Four \$500 scholarships will be awarded annually, one to a graduating senior from each Elk County High School.

William R. Buhite Jr. Memorial Scholarship

William Buhite Jr. felt that education is not just a grade or your rank in class, it is about what you learned and how you applied your learning to everyday life. Bill was a loving husband, father and son and an excellent teacher. As a teacher in the Ridgway Area School District from 1997-2013, he enjoyed his work and loved making an impact on his students' lives. Teaching was not a job to him-it was his calling. Teaching defined him - there were always students in his room, whether they were part of his class or just wanted to learn something. Bill's love for education never ceased. In 2013 he became an in-house trainer for Allegheny Contracting where he taught employees the skills needed to succeed in their fields. It is hoped that the student who receives this scholarship will continue Bill's legacy through education and learning. \$500 will be awarded annually to a Ridgway Area High School senior who will be attending a trade/vocational school.

Randy Yetzer Memorial Scholarship

Randy K. Yetzer, a lifelong resident of the area, received an associate degree from Triangle Tech in construction. After working for numerous construction companies over the years he had a dream of owning his own business and eventually reached that goal by establishing Yetzer Builders and then Yetzer Contracting. He was a well-respected businessman and will always be remembered for offering a helping hand to anyone that needed assistance. Having a trade was very important to him. By developing a skill and being able to work with your hands he felt anyone could have a successful career. Randy always believed in trade schools, and some of his best employees were students. His family established this scholarship in his name to provide financial assistance to a student who is going into the trades and has a good work ethic. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded annually, one to a graduating senior from SMAHS and one to ECCHS.











David F. Auman Memorial Scholarship

This memorial scholarship was established by Dave's parents, Fran & Sharyn. Dave was a lifelong resident of the area and a 1993 graduate of Elk County Catholic High School. He graduated from the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford and Clarion University with a degree in special education. He was a supervisor at Abraxus Youth Services in Marienville PA. While in high school he played football, and lifting weights was one of his hobbies. Approximately \$500 will be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Elk County Catholic High School who is interested in the field of Criminal Justice, Special Education, or Social Services.

T.O. Fitch Memorial Scholarship

T.O. Fitch's life was cut short by COVID complications in 2021, but not before he made a lasting impact on Ridgway where he lived and worked. His key traits were sheer grit, a charitable heart that pushed community development efforts, and an entrepreneurial spirit. Although he no longer is able to inspire others to demonstrate these traits, it is the hope of his family that this scholarship will reward a student that exhibits similar traits and that they can create a comparable legacy of their own. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to an Elk County graduating senior or non-traditional adult learner.



4-H STEM grant brings enrichment program to Elk County schools
